<p><i>The Doctrine of Justification tells us:</i></p>	<p><i>The Doctrine of Sanctification tells us:</i></p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● how a person is made right with God</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● how a person grows in the Christian life</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● about God's gracious action towards us</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● about our response to God</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● that God is for us, forgiving and saving us from sin</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● how God works in us, helping us to leave our sin behind</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● that God adopts us as God's children</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● that God expects us to live as brothers and sisters</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● that we are free <i>from</i> the self-justification that breaks relationship with God and others</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● what it means to live as people free <i>for</i> God, free <i>for</i> others, and therefore free <i>for</i> our own self-fulfillment</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● that Christ is our <b>Savior</b></li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● that Christ is our <b>Lord</b></li> </ul>
