What Are the Different Types of Sexuality?

LGBTQIA+ is an inclusive term that includes people of all sexual identities and gender identities. The "+" refers to embers of other LGBTQIA+ communities and allies. LGBTQIA+ stands for:

- Lesbian those who identify as lesbian are usually women who feel sexual and romantic attraction toward other women. Some nonbinary people may also identify as lesbians.
- Gay a person who identifies as gay typically only feels sexual attraction toward people of the same gender. Socially, people use this term to refer to men who are romantically and sexually attracted to men. However, those in the community use it as an umbrella term.
- Bisexual a person who identifies as bisexual can be of any gender. Bisexuality means that a person feels attraction toward their own gender and other genders or toward anyone regardless of their gender.
- Transgender an umbrella term used to describe people whose true gender identity does not "match" the sex or gender they were assigned at birth.
 This may include individuals who identify as non-binary—an umbrella term, and this may mean respecting the ways they choose to identify themselves.
- Questioning or queer people of all sexualities under the LGBTQIA+ umbrella may also identify as queer. It is not a good idea for people outside of these communities to use this term.
- Intersex a person who is born with a combination of male and female biological traits.
- Asexual an umbrella term that encompasses a broad spectrum of sexual orientations. Some people may experience no sexual or romantic attraction toward anyone, while others may experience varying degrees of sexual or romantic attraction toward people. Those who identify with this orientation do not have to abstain from sex to be asexual.

Biblical Passages Addressing Sexuality

Genesis 19:1-10

......Where are the men who came to you tonight? Bring them out to us so that we can have sex with them.....

Leviticus 18:22 and 20:13

Do not have sexual relations with a man as one does with a woman; that is detestable.

If a man has sexual relations with a man as one does with a woman, both of them have done what is detestable. They are to be put to death; their blood will be on their own heads.

Romans 1:26-27

Because of this, God gave them over to shameful lusts. Even their women exchanged natural sexual relations for unnatural ones. ²⁷ In the same way the men also abandoned natural relations with women and were inflamed with lust for one another. Men committed shameful acts with other men and received in themselves the due penalty for their error.

I Corinthians 6:9

Or do you not know that wrongdoers will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: Neither the sexually immoral nor idolaters nor adulterers nor men who have sex with men .

1 Timothy 1:9-10

We also know that the law is made not for the righteous but for lawbreakers and rebels, the ungodly and sinful, the unholy and irreligious, for those who kill their fathers or mothers, for murderers, ¹⁰ for the sexually immoral, for those practicing homosexuality, for slave traders and liars and perjurers—and for whatever else is contrary to the sound doctrine.

Rule of Love

How does this passage help the reader (you, us) better fulfill Scripture's highest law to 'Love your Lord with all your heart, your soul, your mind, and your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself?'

Issues PC(USA) Faced Addressing LGBTQIA Issues (civil rights, same-sex marriage, ordination)

- Interpreting scripture/differing interpretations
- LGBTQIA+ is not a "lifestyle choice" or something to "cure"
- What are we called to do as followers/disciples of Christ?
- Respecting differing views while finding ways to be more inclusive, welcoming

Where Are We Now as Presbyterians?

- People of faith may differ on the issue
- Decisions on ordination, same-gender marriage will be left to each congregation
- Faith, religious liberty cannot be used to discriminate against anyone simply because of who they are
- Apologizes for previous unwelcoming stance on LGBTQ parishioners and states the church will welcome, lift up, and fight for the human rights of all people created in the eyes of God.

National Laws for Same-Sex Relationships

- Nearly 200 hundred countries
- 70 countries criminalize same-sex relations and punish people who openly identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender or queer
- 26 nations penalize offenders with prison sentences ranging from ten years to life
- 7 countries impose the death penalty
- 29 countries have legalized same-sex marriages, including the United States
- The number of Americans who favor allowing same-sex marriages increased to 62 percent in 2017 and has now leveled off
- 80 percent of Americans who are religiously unaffiliated favor same-sex marriage
- 66 percent of white mainline Protestants support same-sex marriage in 2019
- 61 percent of white mainline Catholics support same-sex marriage in 2019
- 29 percent of white evangelical Protestants support same-sex marriage in 2019
